Winter Build Projects


Great Planes Patriot XL

In the spirit of showing off winter build progress, your editor, Michael McCullough, brought in his Great Planes Patriot XL (below left) being built from a kit. Now, this is progress over many winters, but the aircraft structure is mostly done and it is about ready to be covered. The plane is jet-shaped but still propeller driven (a poor man's jet). It has pneumatic retracts and will one day be powered by an OS 75 AX. When you build from a kit, the instructions will only get you so far. I appreciate the advice the other members gave to finish this project. One tip was regarding the control linkage of dedicated flaps.

Jeff Borowski suggested designing the control linkage such that when the flaps are fully deployed, the servo control horn and the control linkage are lined up. Therefore the servo does not need to strain to hold the flap down against wind resistance.

Goldberg Piper J-3 Cub

Ken Ceranski e-mailed a picture of his Goldberg Piper J-3 Cub (below right) that is under construction. Ken says his Cub will be powered by a Fox 50BBRC engine. I understand it flys like a scale floater with the full wingspan or like an aerobatic thriller with a reduced wingspan. Thanks for sharing!





DRONE LAW

2013 Wisconsin Act 213 - Enacted April 8, 2014

It's amazing how much drones are in the media these days. If you have been keeping up with the news or even just watching TV, you have probably come across some story, show, or commercial that mentions a drone. Going from a hobby with simple beginnings to abundant commercial applications has caught the eye of politicians wanting to regulate their use. Whether you like or despise politics, it is important to know the rules and what's going on that could impact the hobby.

New Wisconsin drone law

Ron Szuta has shared with us information that a bill was passed by the Wisconsin State Senate. The Wisconsin law outlines some rules pertaining to civilians and law enforcement. Now, I am by no means a lawyer, but these are the main points of the law as summarized and interpreted by the average Joe:

- Law enforcement agencies are prohibited from using drones to gather evidence without first obtaining a warrant.
- It is a Class H Felony to operate a weaponized drone, unless you are in the Armed Forces operating in official capacity.
- It is a Class A misdemeanor to observe/record another person in a place that has a reasonable expectation of privacy, again, unless you are in law enforcement with authorization.

Federal rules and regulations on the horizon

The FAA also has been in the news enforcing regulations (that arguably don't exist) concerning commercial use of drones in the national airspace. In March, the

Washington Nationals baseball team used a drone during spring training in Florida to take publicity photos of the players. The FAA has banned any commercial use of drones while



regulations to integrate them into the airspace are being developed, with penalties up to \$10,000. So I guess the Brewers won't be using a drone to take pictures of Hank anytime soon.

So, what does that mean to us? Fortunately, the FAA still permits hobbyists to fly model aircraft, but recommends voluntary guidelines, including staying away from airports, flying no higher than 400 feet, and staying within the line of sight of the operator. We fly at an AMA chartered field with that sole purpose. There are not homes around the field; therefore, if we choose to take aerial photographs, there is not a possibility of an invasion of privacy. The U.S. Congress has asked the FAA to develop initial regulations by 2015. Stay tuned.
