## World's Only Antonov AN-255 Destroyed

Please note, this article is not meant to diminish the loss of life that is currently happening in Ukraine. We are an aviation community and share local or significant aviation-related information.

The world's largest cargo plane was destroyed outside Kyiv, Ukraine by Russian forces. The Antonov AN-255 Mriya (meaning Dream in Ukrainian) conducted its first flight in December of 1988, while Ukraine was still apart of the former Soviet Union. Only one aircraft was ever produced, although a second was planned, but never delivered.

Most recently, the AN-255 was supporting the COVID-19 relief effort, transporting medical supplies between countries in Asia and Europe. However, the Mriya was originally developed to support the Soviet space program and carry the Buran orbiters (Soviet space shuttle). After the collapse of the Soviet Union, the AN-255 was placed into storage in 1994, but was restored and returned to service in 2001.

The aircraft has set numerous records, including carrying the heaviest single cargo item ever in August 2009 - a generator for a gas power plant in Armenia weighing 189 tonnes (416,674 lbs). The following summer, it flew the longest air-cargo item ever - two 138ft wind turbine blades in Denmark.

The operational life of the aircraft was expected to last until at least 2033 thanks to a recent refurbishment. Ukrainian authorities have said that they will rebuild the plane.


### Winter Projects
